

Deanery Training Advisers:

What do they do?

Your Deanery Training Adviser -

Do you know how yours can help you?

1. Purpose of the role:

To help implement the diocesan vision and strategy for “growing disciples of all ages” as we all engage more in Christian learning and ministry.

The Deanery Training Adviser will work together with all the clergy and church members in your deanery, to enable people:

- To learn and grow in their faith;
- To apply their faith in their everyday lives;
- To discover their God-given gifts and new skills;
- To serve God more fully.

To achieve this, the Training Adviser will help to develop learning opportunities which:

- Meet local needs;
- Suit local opportunities and are accessible to all;
- Provide an integrated pathway of growth in discipleship;
- Use and develop existing local resources (people and activities);
- Encourage collaboration and sharing in ministry and mission.

2. Main tasks

(a) Advising Parish Clergy and lay leaders

Parish clergy are responsible for the development of faith and lay ministry in their parishes. However, we can all benefit from some extra help and resources, and the Deanery Training Adviser will be able to offer this.

The Deanery Training Adviser will:

- Identify training needs and resources in each Parish in the Deanery and encourage collaborative working between parishes to meet the needs and share the resources;
- Encourage clergy to develop opportunities for lay people in their parish to discover and explore the Christian faith. (eg. Using “Essence”, “Alpha,” the “Start” course etc.)
- Promote the discernment and development of gifts and ministries in all God’s people in the parishes (perhaps using the course ‘*Your SHAPE for God’s Service*’);

- Work closely with clergy, Readers, commissioned Local Lay Ministers and other lay leaders, through visits to parishes, PCCs, Clergy Chapter, Deanery Synod, etc.;
- Develop a portable ‘library’ of a wide range of published materials to use in advising on the resources available for Christian growth and learning. These can be lent out to clergy/church leaders.

(b) Co-ordinating Deanery Training Courses

The Deanery Training Adviser will be responsible for:

- Organising regular faith development and discipleship programmes and groups (eg. *Rooted in Jesus* or *Emmaus*) in the Deanery, as a next step on from the basics of the Christian faith. This will include recruiting members and training leaders;
- Co-ordinating the provision of a menu of ‘Short Courses’ and training events to meet needs in the Deanery (eg, Resourcing the Diocesan Vision for growing disciples) and to develop specific skills, interests, and to build up lay ministries;
- Creating publicity for all Christian learning opportunities within the deanery;
- Building up a resource group/network of people in the deanery who can help to make all this happen!

(c) Relating to commissioned ‘Local Lay Ministers’

The Deanery Training Adviser will be involved in advising and encouraging Local LMs during their ‘four-year vocational journey’ and overseeing their learning programme in liaison with the Ministry Development Officer.

(d) Advising on Vocation

Acting as a deanery resource for people wishing to explore a possible vocation to some sort of accredited ministry (eg. Local Lay Minister, Reader, Priest, Church Army etc.).

3. Other Information

- The role of DTA is voluntary, for between one and two days per week in each deanery. In some deaneries, this may be shared between two people, for example each doing one day per week;
- Some Deanery Training Advisers are ordained, and others are lay.
