Saturday 1 September

Anglican Communion Diocese of Guildford, Province of Canterbury, England, The Rt Revd Andrew John Watson and, Diocese of Guildford-Dorking, The Rt Revd Jo Balley Wells, clergy and people.

The Diocese is part of the Province of Canterbury, one of two in England, covering the southern half of England. The Structure of the Church of England emerged from the missionary work of St Augustine, sent from Rome in 597, and from the work of Celtic Missionaries in the north. The Diocese of Guildford was founded 1927. It covers the western two thirds of Surrey, south of the Thames except for a small area in the north east (Southwark), areas of north east Hampshire, a few parishes in Greater London and one parish in West Sussex.

Anglican Communion Anglican Church of South America, The Most Revd Gregory James Venables, Presiding Bishop of the Anglican Church of South America & Bishop of Argentina.

The Anglican Church in South America British immigrants brought Anglicanism to South America during the nineteenth century. The South American Missionary Society continues to work among indigenous peoples.

Monday 3 September

Gregory the Great, Bishop, Teacher, 540-604

The Son of a Roman Senator, (inherited great wealth) became prefect of Rome but later sold all his estates and founded seven monasteries, entering one of them himself. As abbot, he is reputed to have seen some ‘fair haired’ slaves in the market and hearing that they were Angles, decided on a mission to England. But before he could go, Gregory was elected as Pope (Gregory I) and Augustine was sent to England in his place. Gregory took a group of monks with him to the Vatican and continued to live the monastic life there. He was a prodigious writer and many of his pastoral letters, books and commentaries survive.

Church of the Province of West Africa includes Cameroon, Ghana, Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone and The Gambia. Total population 45 million of which 10 million are Christians, and 1 million are Anglicans with 600 parishes and 450 clergy.

The Province of North India has 27 Diocese and was inaugurated in 1970 after many years of preparation. It includes the Anglican Church, the United Church of Northern India (Congregationalist and Presbyterian). The Methodist Church (British and Australian Conferences), the Council of Baptist Churches in Northern India, the Church of the Brethren in India, and the Disciples of Christ. Along with the Church of South India, the Church of Pakistan, and the Church of Bangladesh, it is one of the four United Churches.

Prior to 1990, the northern two thirds of Nigeria was largely blocked, however eight new bishops were consecrated, paid for by

Lagos parishes. It is the second largest province in the Anglican Communion, as measured by baptized membership, after the Church of England. Since 2002 the Church of Nigeria is organised in 10 ecclesiastical provinces. It has rapidly increased the number of its dioceses and bishops from 91 to 122. The administrative headquarters are in Abuja.

The West Indies became a self-governing Province of the worldwide Anglican Communion in 1883 because of the Church of England missions in territories that became British colonies. It is made up of two mainland dioceses and six island dioceses, including Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Nassau and the Bahamas, Tobago, Trinidad, and the Windward Islands. Great emphasis is being placed on training personnel for an indigenous ministry. The island locations and scattered settlements make pastoral care difficult and costly.

Saturday 8 September ***Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary***

The Calendars of the Anglican, Roman Catholic and Orthodox Churches all celebrate the life of the Blessed Virgin Mary on five occasions during each year: 15 August, 1 January, 25 March, 31 May, and 8 September.

Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. There was no resident Bishop for nearly two hundred years, causing problems when many of the clergy sided with the Crown during the American Revolution. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces, 98 Dioceses and 20 overseas jurisdictions.

SUNDAY 9 September Trinity 15

The Province of the South Sudan The Church was inaugurated in 1947 by the union of the South India United Church (itself a union of Congregational and Presbyterian/Reformed traditions), the southern Anglican diocese of the Church of India, Burma, Ceylon, and the Methodist Church in South India. It is one of the four United Churches in the Anglican Communion. There are 22 Dioceses.

The Province of Central Africa includes Botswana, Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The first Anglican missionary to Malawi was Bishop Charles Mackenzie, who arrived with David Livingstone in 1861. The Province was inaugurated in 1955 and has a movable bishopric. The countries forming the Province are very different. Zambia and Botswana suffer the difficulties of rapid industrialization, along with underdeveloped, thinly populated areas. In Malawi, 30 per cent of the adult males are away as migrant labourers in other countries at any given time. Zimbabwe

is experiencing problems of social adjustment after independence. The Province has 15 Dioceses for a population of nearly 32 million.

Thursday 13 September *St John Chrysostom, Bishop, Teacher*

John studied at Antioch and became a monk, then was called to be patriarch of Constantinople. An austere man, who lived simply, he incurred the opposition of the imperial court for his attacks on their morals and extravagance. The Empress Endoxia defied him and he attracted the enmity of Theophilus, patriarch of Alexandria, whom he denounced as corrupt. Theophilus summoned a council who condemned John and then exiled him; John was harried from place to place. Seventeen letters from John to Olympias (also persecuted) survive, but frail and exhausted, John died in exile.

The Province is the oldest in Africa. British Anglicans met for worship in Cape Town after 1806, with the first Bishop appointed in 1847. The 28 dioceses of the Province extend beyond the Republic of South Africa and include the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (St Helena and Tristan da Cunha), Mozambique (Lebombo and Niassa), the Republic of Namibia, the Kingdom of Lesotho, the Kingdom of Swaziland and Angola.

Saturday 15 September *St Cyprian, Bishop, Martyr, 200-258*

Cyprian of Roman stock, studied law and rhetoric before becoming a Christian then ordained and became Bishop of Carthage. During the persecution of the Emperor Decian he went into exile, but wrote pastoral letters to his people. When the persecutions finished he had to deal with the Lapsi (Christians who had agreed to worship the Roman Gods); he ruled that they should undergo penances but, after an interval, be re-admitted to the Church. In later persecutions, under Decian, Cyprian again went into exile but returned to Carthage and was martyred there.

In the Episcopal Church of The Sudan, there are around 5 million Anglicans. The Anglican Church increased considerably and in November 2013 The Episcopal Church of Sudan decided to rename itself as Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan and to divide the Episcopal Church of South Sudan in eight internal provinces.

Monday 17 September

St Hildegard, Abbess, Visionary, 1098-1179

Hildegard was Prioress of a Benedictine monastery for women in the Rhine Valley and dictated her visions to a monk named Volmar. She wrote many letters of counsel and advice to people in authority, including four popes. She was also a poet and has been compared to Dante and to Blake. Today, she is probably best known for her church music, much of which has dissonances and passages in a minor key which appeals to modern ears.

The Anglican chaplains and missionaries worked in Burma in the early and mid-nineteenth century. The Province of Myanmar was formed in 1970, nine years after the declaration of Buddhism as the state religion and four years after all foreign missionaries were forced to leave. The church is not involved in social work as this field of action is totally taken over by the government. The Church of Myanmar has 6 Dioceses.

The Anglican Witness in Canada started in the eighteenth century with the Church Missionary Society and the United Society for the Propagation of the Gospel. The Eucharist was first celebrated in Frobisher Bay in 1578; the first Church building was St. Paul's, Halifax, in 1750. The Church includes a large number of the original inhabitants of Canadian Indians, Inuit, and Metis and has been a strong advocate of their rights. Canada's population has just over 2 million Anglicans in 34 Dioceses.

Wednesday 19 September *Theodore of Tarsus, Archbishop, 602-690*

When Islam became dominant in Asia Minor, Theodore went to Italy and became a monk-scholar in Rome. At the age of 66 he was sent to England to heal the divisions between the Celtic and Latin clergy. Bede says "he visited every part of the island". He called two episcopal synods, re-organised the dioceses and appointed new bishops. He was sometimes ruthless but highly efficient. Bede recounts how he dealt with Chad, first declaring that his consecration to York was invalid, but then, pleased with his humility, consecrated him and sent him to Mercia. Theodore died at the age of 88 having established the structure originally envisaged by Pope Gregory the Great when he sent Augustine on his mission.

According to Mt 9.9 he was the tax gatherer, called by Christ, whom Mk (5.27) calls Levi. He probably had both names. He was a Jew and, according to Papias, made a collection of Christ's sayings in Hebrew. He is traditionally the author of the first Gospel (as printed in the NT). Often depicted with a sword, a money-bag or a carpenter's square.

There are 16 bishops and the 19 dioceses represent both evangelical and Anglo-Catholic Churches.

Tuesday 25 September *Bishop Lancelot Andrewes*

Lancelot Andrewes was an English bishop and scholar, who held high positions in the Church of England during the reigns of Elizabeth 1 and James 1. During the latter's reign, Andrewes served successively as Bishop of Chichester of Ely and of Winchester. He also oversaw the translation of the King James Version of the Bible. He is commemorated on 25 September with a Lesser Festival.

Carlile was an English evangelist who founded the Church Army and was Prebendary of St Paul's Cathedral. Known as "The Chief," Wilson Carlile inspired generations of evangelists. Carlile persisted in trying to acquaint clerics and public officials in major cities with Church Army's aims, ideas and methods. With increasing support from a few bishops, the Army gradually gained the respect of the Church. By 1925, the Church Army grew to become the largest home mission society in the Church of England.

Thursday 27 September *St Vincent de Paul, Founder of the Lazarists, 1580-1660*

Born in a peasant family in Gascony, France. He was educated by Franciscans, and became a Chaplain at the French court and a spiritual director to wealthy and noble families, though never losing his devotion to the poor. In 1625 he founded a Brotherhood of priests to work with the poor and depressed and in 1633 founded the Sisters of Charity to work in the villages. The Brotherhood was abolished at the time of the French Revolution but was re-founded in 1833 by Antoine Frederick Ozanam as the Society of St Vincent de Paul.

Michael the Archangel is mentioned four times in Scripture, twice in Daniel (10.13 and 12.1), once in Jude (v.9) (in a dispute over the body of Moses) and once in Revelation 12.7-9, fighting the dragon. He was, in the early days of the Church regarded as the helper of Christian armies against the heathens. Throughout the Middle Ages St Michael was much venerated and many churches are dedicated to him.
