Tuesday 1 August

Anglican Communion Diocese of Port Elizabeth, Province of Southern Africa, The Rt Revd Nceba Nopece, clergy and people.

The Province is the oldest in Africa. British Anglicans met for worship in Cape Town after 1806, with the first Bishop appointed in 1847. The 23 dioceses of the Province extend beyond the Republic of South Africa and include the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (St Helena and Tristan da Cunha), Mozambique (Lebombo and Niassa), the Republic of Namibia, the Kingdom of Lesotho, the Kingdom of Swaziland and Angola.

The Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea Province was founded 1977. It has a Population of 4 million with 3.8 million Christians, there are 140,000 Anglicans in five Dioceses with 126 Parishes.

In the Episcopal Church of The Sudan, out of a total population of 30 million, there are 5 million Anglicans and almost three thousand Anglican clergy. The Anglican Church has grown significantly during the period of persecution.

Friday 4 August

Anglican Communion Diocese of Portsmouth, Province of Canterbury, England, The Rt Revd Christopher Foster, clergy and people.

The Diocese was founded in 597 in Kent, east of the Medway, excluding the Medway Towns (Rochester). It has a population of about 840,000, with 149 clergy for 157 benefices with 262 parishes and 330 churches.

Saturday 5 August ***St Oswald***

Oswald, King and martyr, (605-642) was exiled to Iona at the age of ten and educated by monks for eighteen years. He returned to Northumbria as king and won a battle at Hexham defeating Penda of Mercia and his ally, Cadwalla of Wales. He brought missionary monks from Iona to the area and Aidan became his bishop and his friend. Oswald often interpreted for Aidan, who was not fluent in English; Oswald gave to him Holy Island as a refuge. Bede describes Oswald as “a merciful and just king” who promoted peace in the kingdom. He died in battle against Penda of Mercia, aged 38.

SUNDAY 6 August **The Transfiguration**

Anglican Diocese of Puerto Rico, The XI Episcopal Church, The Rt
Communion Revd Wilfrido Ramos Orench, clergy and people.

Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. There was no resident Bishop for some two hundred years, causing problems when many of the clergy sided with the Crown during the American Revolution. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces, 98 Dioceses, plus 20 overseas jurisdictions.

Monday 7 August

Anglican Communion Diocese of Pune, Province of North India, The Rt Revd Andrew Rathod, clergy and people.

The Province of North India was inaugurated in 1970 after many years of preparation. It includes the Anglican Church, the United Church of Northern India (Congregationalist and Presbyterian). The Methodist Church (British and Australian Conferences), the Council

of Baptist Churches in Northern India, the Church of the Brethren in India, and the Disciples of Christ. Along with the Church of South India, the Church of Pakistan, and the Church of Bangladesh, it is one of the four United Churches with 27 Dioceses.

Tuesday 8 August ***St Dominic, Priest, Founder of the Order of Preachers, 1170-1221***

Dominic was born in Spain and became an Augustinian friar and Founder of the 'Order of Preachers', also known as the Dominicans or Black Friars. The Dominicans started as a small group of preachers whose task was to convert the heretical Cathars. Under Simon de Montfort's military crusade, the Cathars were overcome and the Dominicans developed into a new Order which received official approval in 1217. The movement spread throughout Christendom.

The Anglican Witness in Canada started in the eighteenth century with the Church Missionary Society and the United Society for the Propagation of the Gospel. The Eucharist was first celebrated in Frobisher Bay in 1578; the first Church building was St. Paul's, Halifax, built in 1750. The Church includes a large number of the original inhabitants of Canadian Indians, Inuit, and Metis and has

been a strong advocate of their rights. Canada's population is 31 million of which 22 million are Christians with just over 2 million Anglicans in 34 Dioceses.

Wednesday 9 August *Mary Sumner, Founder of the Mothers' Union, 1828-1921*

The mother of 'the Mothers' Union". Mary was 57 and an Archdeacon's wife when she spoke at a Church Congress in 1885 and called for a new movement for women. Mary travelled England (her own children being married and independent) addressing meetings, drafting rules, leaflets and membership cards. By 1892 there were 28 diocesan branches, 1550 branches and over 60,000 members. With Mary Sumner as President and Queen Victoria as patron, it spread to Australia, Canada, India and later to the West Indies, Japan, S America and Africa.

Thursday 10 August *St Laurence, Deacon, Martyr, 258*

One of the seven deacons of Rome in the time of Pope Sixtus II; Laurence was responsible for the care of church property and for

administering alms to the poor. Laurence was ordered to produce an inventory of Church treasures, for the Emperor; he then sold sacred vessels and gave the money to the poor, telling the Prefect of Rome "These (the halt, lame, blind) are my treasures". Under the persecution of Valerian, the Pope and four deacons were executed; Laurence was executed four days after the Pope.

The Church was inaugurated in 1947 by the union of the South India United Church (itself a union of Congregational and Presbyterian/Reformed traditions), the southern Anglican diocese of the Church of India, Burma, Ceylon, and the Methodist Church in South India. It is one of the four United Churches in the Anglican Communion. There are 22 Dioceses.

Friday 11 August

***St Clare of Assisi, founder of the Poor Clares,
1253***

Clare of Assisi was born into a wealthy family who wanted her to make a dynastic marriage. In 1212 she started a woman's branch of the Franciscan Order. Her widowed mother, two sisters and an aunt together with other women from noble families, formed a small community at San Damiano, where Clare was appointed abbess. The Pope tried to impose the Benedictine Rule on the nuns but Clare insisted that they, like the friars, must be free to live in poverty and minister to the poor. It was not until 1253 that Pope Innocent III accepted her

suggested Rule and they became the first unenclosed Order for Women.

Expatriate Anglican chaplaincies were established in Brazil in 1810, with missionary work beginning in 1889, after the separation of Church and State. The Province, which is one of the few Portuguese speaking churches in the Communion, became autonomous in 1965. In 1990, Brazil's economic and social problems prompted the Partners in Mission Consultation to focus on three priorities: education, service, and expansion. The population of Brazil is almost 156 million of which only 100,000 are baptised Anglicans. There are 7 Dioceses and 131 clergy.

Anglican Communion Diocese of Remo, Province of Lagos, Nigeria, The Rt Revd Michael Fape, clergy and people.

Nigeria is the second largest province in the Anglican Communion, as measured by baptized membership, after the Church of England. Prior to 1990, membership in the northern two thirds of Nigeria was limited. Following the consecration of eight new bishops, project work has been successful. The membership is now over 25 million, out of a total population of 104 million. Since 2002, the Anglican Church of Nigeria is organised in 10 ecclesiastical provinces and has rapidly increased the number of its dioceses and bishops. The administrative headquarters are in Abujae.

Maximilian Kolbe

Maximilian Kolbe was born on 8 January 1894 in Polland, and died on 14 August 1941. A Polish Conventual Franciscan F, who volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the German death camp of Auschwitz, located in German-occupied Poland during World War II. He was active in promoting the veneration of the Immaculate Virgin Mary, founding and supervising the monastery of Niepokalanów near Warsaw. Kolbe was canonized on 10 October 1982 by Pope John Paul II, and declared a Martyr of charity.

The Province of the Anglican Church of Australia; the Church arrived in Australia in 1788 with the First Fleet, which was made up primarily of convicts and military personnel. A General Synod held in 1872 formed the Australian Board of Missions; missionary work among the Aborigines and the Torres Strait Islanders was key to the growth of the Church. The Anglican Church of Australia is part of the Christian Conference of Asia and of the Council of the Church of East Asia. Links with Churches of New Guinea, Melanesia and Polynesia are strong, especially through the Australian Board of Mission. A Population 18 million, including 12.5m Christians, 4m Anglicans and approximately 3,000 Parishes, and 2000 clergy.

Anglicans are in a minority in a predominantly Roman Catholic, it can also be a dangerous country, where priests and pastors have been killed. The population is almost 6 million, there are 300,000 Anglicans, 5 Dioceses, 170 priest and 150 parishes.

St Augustine of Hippo

Saint Augustine, also called Saint Augustine of Hippo, was born November 13, 354, and died August 28, 430, Hippo Regius. He was bishop of Hippo from 396 to 430, one of the Latin Fathers of the Church, one of the Doctors of the Church, and perhaps the most significant Christian thinker after St. Paul. Augustine's adaptation of classical thought to Christian teaching created a theological system of great power and lasting influence. His numerous written works, the most important of which are Confessions and City of God, shaped the practice of biblical exegesis and helped lay the foundation for much of medieval and modern Christian thought.

The population of Uganda is around 23 million, 89% of whom are Christians (RC 38%; Anglicans 34%). 12% are Muslims. The Anglican Province of Uganda has tripled in size in the past 10 years. There are now 29 Dioceses for 6,700,000 Anglicans, with 28 bishops, 13,800 congregations, 1,731 parishes, 2,630 priests and 13,000 Readers and catechists.

John Bunyan, spiritual writer 1628-1688

A Bedfordshire tinker who mended pots, pans and farm implements. His only reading matter was probably the Bible. After his dramatic conversion he joined the Bedford Meeting of Dissenters and after the Restoration (of Charles II) was arrested as “a dangerous and notorious Dissenter”. He refused to give up preaching and was sent to the county gaol where he remained from 1660-1672. During this period he wrote “Grace Abounding” (auto biographical) and part of “Pilgrim’s Progress”. This allegory of Christian’s journey through life, written in the English of the Authorised Version of the Bible, has become a classic of religious writing

St Aidan, bishop, missionary in 651 and was a monk of Iona, sent to Northumbria by King Oswald who had been an exile on Iona and whilst there taught by Celtic monks. Aidan and Oswald were friends and

together worked to evangelise and Oswald gave the Island of Lindisfarne as a place of prayer. Aidan founded churches, monasteries and schools. Lindisfarne was sacked by Vikings in 793 and no visible signs of Aidan's work remains but visitors still find it to be a holy place.
