The Province of North India was inaugurated in 1970, it includes; the Anglican Church, the United Church of Northern India (Congregationalist and Presbyterian), The Methodist Church (British and Australian Conferences), the Council of Baptist Churches in Northern India, the Church of the Brethren in India, and the Disciples of Christ. It is one of the four United Churches.

Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces and 20 overseas jurisdictions.

Prior to 1990, the northern two thirds of Nigeria was largely blocked, when eight new bishops consecrated. Since 2002 the Church of Nigeria is organised in 10 ecclesiastical provinces. The administrative headquarters are in Abuja.

The West Indies became a self-governing Province of the worldwide Anglican Communion in 1883 because of the Church of England missions in territories that became British colonies. It is made up of two mainland dioceses and six island dioceses, including Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Nassau and the Bahamas, Tobago, Trinidad, and the Windward Islands.

The Episcopal Church of Sudan decided to rename itself as Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan in November 2013 and to divide the Episcopal Church of South Sudan in eight internal provinces.

With its history as a Spanish colony, the Philippines were predominantly Roman Catholic. When Americans colonized the country in 1898, Anglican missionary work began in the north and south. The Church consecrated its first Bishop in 1963 and became an autonomous Province in 1990. Four dioceses were established by 1971.

After 118 years of missionary association with the Church of the Province of New Zealand, the Church of the Province of Melanesia was formed in 1975. The Province encompasses the Republic of Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, and the French Trust Territory of New Caledonia, both sovereign island nations in the South Pacific.

The Universities Mission to Central Africa and the Church Missionary Society began work in 1864 and 1878 at Mpwapwa. The Province was inaugurated in 1970 following the division of the Province of East Africa into the Province of Kenya and the Province of Tanzania.

Swithun was educated in Winchester and became Chaplain to King Egbert of Wessex and Bishop of Winchester, then the royal capital, in 852. The tradition about raining for forty days derives from two elements; Swithun had requested that he should be buried in the ordinary cemetery outside the west door of the Old Minster "where his

grave might be trodden on by passers by and the rain fall upon it". During the rebuilding of the Cathedral in 1971, the walls were extended to include his tomb and there was a period of very heavy rainfall which was attributed to Swithun.

Iglesia Anglicana de la Region Central de America is one of the newest in the Anglican Communion and is made up of the dioceses of Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, and Panama. With the exception of Costa Rica, all had been part of the Episcopal Church of the United States of America. The Church was introduced by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel when England

administered two colonies in Central America, Belize (1783-1982) and Miskitia (1740-1894). In later years, Afro-Antillean people brought their Anglican Christianity with them.

St Mary Magdalene

Mary was one of a group of women who followed Jesus and whom he cured of 'infirmities and evil spirits'. She was close to Jesus at the Crucifixion and at his burial; she went with Joseph of Arimathea to secure the release of the body of Jesus from Pilate. Mary also went to the tomb early on the day of the Resurrection and, was the first to see the risen Lord and ran to tell the Apostles. Mary was therefore known in mediaeval times as 'the apostle to the Apostles'.

The Province of Central Africa includes Botswana, Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The first Anglican missionary to Malawi was Bishop Charles Mackenzie, who arrived with David Livingstone in 1861. The Province was inaugurated in 1955 and has a movable bishopric. The countries forming the Province are very different. Zambia and Botswana suffer the difficulties of rapid

industrialization, along with underdeveloped, thinly populated areas.

The West Indies became a self-governing Province of the worldwide Anglican Communion in 1883 because of the Church of England missions in territories that became British colonies. It is made up of two mainland dioceses and six island dioceses, including Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Nassau and the Bahamas, Tobago, Trinidad, and the Windward Islands.

The Church in South India was inaugurated in 1947 by the union of the South India United Church (itself a union of Congregational and Presbyterian/Reformed traditions), the southern Anglican diocese of the Church of India, Burma, Ceylon, and the Methodist Church in South India. It is one of the four United Churches in the Anglican Communion with 22 Diocese.

The cult of St James (Santiago) in Compostela was kept with great ceremony although he may never have been to Spain, his relics were thought to have been taken there in the 9th century. His emblems are a staff and scallop-shell.
