Before 1990 the northern two thirds of Nigeria was largely blocked, but eight new bishops were consecrated, paid for by Lagos parishes, and the Project has been highly successful. It is the second largest province in the Anglican Communion, as measured by baptized membership, after the Church of England. Current membership over 25 million, out of a total Nigerian population of 104 million. Since 2002 the Church of Nigeria is organised in 10 ecclesiastical provinces. It has rapidly increased the number of its dioceses and bishops from 91 to 122. There are 3,680 Anglican congregations and 4,000 clergy. The administrative headquarters are in Abuja.

Friday 3 October

George Bell, bishop, ecumenist, peacemaker, 1883 – 1953

Queens Scholar at Westminster School, Christ Church Oxford and Wells TC. Ordained 1907 to a curacy in the industrial slums of Leeds. In 1910, returned to Oxford where he was engaged with the founding of a cooperative for students and university members and with the WEA. From 1914 Chaplain to Archbishop Randall Davidson, whose biography he later wrote. During WW1, and after was much involved in the ecumenical movement and the first post-war meeting of the Royal Council of Churches. Dean of Canterbury 1925 to 1929. From 1929 Bishop of Chichester. Greatly involved in the opposition to the rise of the Nazi party in Germany and was a friend and supporter of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the Confessing Church in Germany and Pastor Martin Niemoller. During WW2 was a vocal critic of the Allies over the area bombing especially of civilians but did not have the support of senior Bishops in the House of Lords. On the death of the Archbishop of Canterbury, William Temple in 1944, many hoped George Bell would succeed him but it was thought that Winston Churchill strongly disapproved of Bell's opposition to bombing. (In 2008 Archbishop Rowan Williams said he thought Bell would have made a better Archbishop than Geoffrey Fisher).

Saturday 4 October

Francis of Assisi, friar, deacon, 1181-1226

The son of a prosperous merchant who dramatically renounced his heritage in order to follow a simple life of poverty and chastity outside the framework of the monastic system. He founded the Friars Minor now the Society of St Francis (SSF), who took literally Christ's injunction to travel and preach the Gospel without money or baggage. Francis always worked within the framework of the Church and his respect for the priesthood led him to refuse ordination as a priest and he remained a deacon and left the management of his Order to others. He encouraged Clare of Assisi to found a parallel Order for women and started a Third Order for lay people willing to commit themselves to a Rule of Life.

Monday 6 October *William Tyndale, translator, martyr, 1494-1536*
He was a biblical scholar who determined to make a new translation of the Bible into English working directly from the Greek. After being rebuffed by the Bishop of London, he went to Germany to work with Lutheran scholars. His translation of the NT was smuggled into England but publicly burned in 1526. He continued to work on the OT but had, frequently, to move house to evade arrest. In 1535 he was arrested in Antwerp and imprisoned. The following year he was executed. His last words were said to have been: 'Lord, open the King of England's eyes'. The beauty of Tyndale's language later became recognised and much of Cranmer's Great Bible of 1539 consists of Tyndale's translations as does much of the Authorised Version of the Bible.

Paulinus was sent from Rome by Gregory the Great to support Augustine of Canterbury on his English mission. Edwin of Northumbria wanted to marry a Kentish princess Ethelburga, a Christian. Edwin was a pagan. Edwin agreed to give Ethelburga and her household freedom to practise their faith and to consider becoming a Christian himself. Paulinus accompanied the princess north, Edwin was converted and, with his household was baptised. Large scale conversions followed and a cathedral was started but Edwin was killed in battle in 633. Paulinus escorted the princess back to Kent and later became Bishop of Rochester.

Monday 13 October*Edward the Confessor, king, 1004-1066*

Edward, son of Ethelread the Unready, was taken to Normandy when his father died in 1016 and remained there for 25 years before he was called back to England as King. A man of great piety who endowed a number of monasteries. Strongly pro-Norman, he brought in many Norman knights and clerics and strengthened links with the Pope. He died on 5 January 1066, his successor Harold was on the throne for less than a year before being defeated by the Normans. Edward was buried in Westminster Abbey.

Wednesday 15 October*Teresa of Avila, teacher of the faith, 1515-82*

The daughter of a wealthy family of Avila who spent twenty years as a Carmelite nun before being able to carry out the reforms for which she is best known. In 1562, reacting against the unreformed Carmelites, she founded a Convent of St Joseph at Avila aiming to return to the primitive Carmelite Rule. Her nuns wore plain habits and rough leather sandals. Their life was one of contemplation, prayer and solitude. She also taught her nuns to dance, sing and be joyful. In spite of increasing age and illness she travelled all over Spain founding new houses and reforming existing ones. Her writings, particularly 'The Way of Perfection', 'The Interior Castle' and her autobiography, are classics,

Thursday 16 October*Nicholas Ridley, 1500-1555, and Hugh Latimer, 1485-1555, bishops, martyrs*

Ridley was one of the 'new men' in the Tudor Church, open to the new insights of the Protestant reformers, though loyal to the existing order. Was a member of the Prayer Book Commission which drafted the Prayer Book of 1549. Became Bishop of Rochester in 1547 and Bishop of London in 1550. When Mary Tudor became queen, he was deposed, sent to the Tower and then to prison in Oxford with Thomas Cranmer and Hugh Latimer. After the Great Disputation at Oxford in 1554, he went to the stake, wearing the robes of a bishop and calling on God to receive his spirit as he died. He is commemorated by Ridley Hall Theological College, Cambridge.

Latimer as Bishop of Worcester, worked hard to reform a rundown diocese where many clergy did not even own a New Testament. But he was too Protestant for Henry VIII and relieved of his bishopric. Under Mary Tudor, and in failing health, he was arrested and imprisoned holding to the view that "the bread is still bread and the wine still wine, for the change is not in the nature but in the dignity". On October 15 he and Nicholas Ridley were both burned at the stake in Oxford.

Friday 17 October *Ignatius of Antioch, bishop, martyr, 37-107*
Ignatius was perhaps a disciple of John the Evangelist. Nothing is known of his life and work until the time of his arrest but he wrote seven letters to other churches while he was being taken to Rome under guard. They are important, giving insight into the theology of the early church. He was thrown to the lions in the Colosseum and died very quickly.

The West Indies became a self-governing Province of the worldwide Anglican Communion in 1883 because of the Church of England missions in territories that became British colonies. It is made up of two mainland dioceses and six island dioceses, including Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Nassau and the Bahamas, Tobago, Trinidad, and the Windward Islands. Great emphasis is being placed on training personnel for an indigenous ministry. The island locations and scattered settlements make pastoral care difficult and costly.

Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. There was no resident Bishop for nearly two hundred years, causing problems when many of the clergy sided with the Crown during the American Revolution. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces, 98 Dioceses, plus 20 overseas jurisdictions. Out of a population of 284 million, only 2 million are Episcopalians, in 7,095 parishes, with 15,310 clergy.

The Church covers the four dioceses of Jerusalem, Iran, Egypt, Cyprus and the Gulf. The Jerusalem bishopric was founded in 1841 and became an archbishopric in 1957. Reorganization in January 1976 ended the archbishopric and combined the Diocese of Jordan, Lebanon, and Syria with the Jerusalem bishopric after a nineteen-year separation. Around the same time, the new Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf was formed and the Diocese of Egypt was revived. The Cathedral Church of St George the Martyr in Jerusalem is known for its ministry to pilgrims. St George's College, Jerusalem, is in partnership with the Anglican Communion.

Saturday 25 October *Crispin and Crispinian, martyrs, c.287*
Two saints thought to have been martyred in the persecution of Maximian or Diocletian. One tradition says they were Roman noblemen who died in Rome. Another says they were missionaries who went to Gaul, earning their living as shoemakers. A third tradition says they fled from Gaul and settled in a house, later the Swan Inn at Faversham. If Henry V did not actually invoke 'Crispin Crispian' before Agincourt, he does so with great effect in Shakespeare's play.

The first Anglican services were held in 1796, and missionaries began their work in 1818. The Church of Ceylon has two Dioceses, Colombo is the older diocese having been founded in 1845 and Kurunagala in 1950. The Church continues as extra provincial under the Archbishop of Canterbury.</i>

<i>Anglican Communion</i>	Diocese of Jaffna (Province of South India), Bishop Daniel Selvaratnam Thiagarajah, clergy and people. <i>The Church was inaugurated in 1947 by the union of the South India United Church (itself a union of Congregational and Presbyterian/Reformed traditions), the southern Anglican diocese of the Church of India, Burma, Ceylon, and the Methodist Church in South India. It is one of the four United Churches in the Anglican Communion. There are 22 Dioceses.</i>

Tuesday 28 October

Simon & Jude, Apostles

Simon the Apostle (first century) is known as Simon Zelotes, to distinguish him from Simon Peter, Simon of Cyrene and other Simons in the Gospels. He may have been a member of the Zealot party but nothing is known about him after Pentecost. He is associated with Jude in commemoration. He is usually shown in art, holding a fish. Jude 'Judas, not Iscariot' (John 14.22). Usually identified with Thaddeus (Matt 10.3 Mark 3.18). Luke 6.16 has "son of James". Author of the Letter of Jude. Simon and Jude are thought to have undertaken a mission in Persia, and to have been martyred there. Jude has become the patron of lost causes.

Wednesday 29 October *James Hannington, bishop, martyr, 1847-1885*
Bishop Hannington's memorial is in the Anglican Cathedral in Kampala, Uganda. After hearing of the death of two missionaries in Central Africa he volunteered for work with CMS and undertook a gruelling journey overland from Zanzibar to Lake Victoria and the source of the Nile in the southern part of Uganda. Back in London he addressed many meetings and was appointed the first Bishop of Equatorial Africa, aged 36. In 1885 he landed at Mombasa and travelled due west through Masai country where he was arrested, imprisoned and shot.

Friday 31 October

Martin Luther, reformer, 1483-1546

Martin was an Augustinian canon, a theologian and official preacher to the parish church at Wittenberg. In protest against the sale of indulgencies by Friar Tetzl in 1517, he nailed his 95 theses to the door of the church. This started a movement which took him and much of northern Europe outside the jurisdiction of the Catholic Church. At the Diet of Worms in 1521 he was required to abjure and reject his many books. He refused, was excommunicated and only escaped imprisonment with the aid of some German princes. The new Protestant theology which developed went far beyond his proposals for reform.

Anglican Communion Diocese of Johannesburg (Province of Southern Africa), Bishop Stephen Mosimanegape Moreo, clergy and people.
The Province is the oldest in Africa. British Anglicans met for worship in Cape Town after 1806, with the first Bishop appointed in 1847. The 23 dioceses of the Province extend beyond the Republic of South Africa and include the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (St Helena and Tristan da Cunha), Mozambique (Lebombo and Niassa), the Republic of Namibia, the Kingdom of Lesotho, the Kingdom of Swaziland and Angola. Total population 80,700,000. 28.5 million Christians. 3 million Anglicans with 28 Dioceses, 1,240 clergy, 994 parishes and 1,900 congregations.
